**Project Overview** 

As part of the 2019 International Youth Day celebrations, the Uganda Women's Network

(UWONET) organized a Dialogue at Makerere University Freedom Square under the

themes "Youth Leadership and Sexual Harassment" and "Unpaid Care and Domestic

Work."

The event sought to mobilize young people to take an active role in addressing gender

inequalities, promote safe learning environments, and challenge social norms that

perpetuate gender-based discrimination.

Comedian and storyteller Akite Agnes participated as part of the creative engagement team,

using performance and humour to help convey key messages on gender equality and youth

empowerment.

**Project Context** 

The 2019 celebration came at a time when the need for youth inclusion and leadership in

gender justice conversations was gaining momentum. UWONET used the occasion to

shine a light on issues affecting young women and men in universities and communities;

particularly sexual harassment, unequal participation in leadership, and the heavy burden

of unpaid care work on women and girls.

By combining art, advocacy, and dialogue, the event aimed to make these topics

approachable and relevant to the youth audience.

## **Implementation**

The day began with a **community marathon**, followed by a **Youth Dialogue moderated by UWONET**. The dialogue provided an open platform for students and youth leaders to reflect on challenges facing young people and propose solutions toward equality and inclusion.

Through **short skits and comedic drama**, Akite and her team introduced the themes of sexual harassment, gender stereotypes, and shared domestic responsibilities in a lively and relatable way.

These performances set the tone for deeper discussion, allowing participants to engage freely and share personal experiences and perspectives during the moderated dialogue.

## **Impact**

The interactive approach helped:

- Create awareness about sexual harassment and gender-based violence in higher education;
- Encourage young men and women to challenge harmful gender norms and stereotypes;
- Promote youth-led leadership in building safer, more equitable learning spaces;
- Reinforce positive attitudes toward sharing unpaid care and domestic work.
- By blending performance with advocacy, the event succeeded in making serious issues accessible and inspiring youth to become active voices for change.
